The prevalence of schizophrenia (ie, the number of cases in a population at any one time point) approaches 1 percent internationally. The incidence (the number of new cases annually) is about 1.5 per 10,000 people [3]. The point prevalence of schizophrenia is about five per thousand in the population. Table 1 presents findings from areas in which credible estimates of both prevalence and incidence are available.
